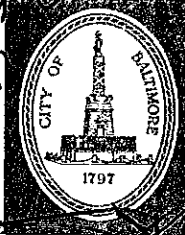

This year, the Department of Public Works will introduce a comprehensive educational presentation to Baltimore City Public School students and faculty. The presentation will provide an overview of functions and services of the Bureau of Water and Waste Water and the Bureau of Solid Waste.
